- Transportation Panel
 - o Panelists:

 - Valley Regional Transit
 - There will be some bus route service changes in June, including two new commuter routes from State Street.
 - The State Street Transit Plan is looking at roadways and supporting infrastructure in the interest of making access to development safe.
 - Ada County Highway District (ACHD)
 - Owns and operates the roads in Ada County, except state highways and private roads.
 - Maranda Gold is the District 3 ACHD Commissioner. She is also a Collister Neighborhood resident.
 - ACHS focuses on pavement management, accessibility and mobility, and planning.
 - They use an Integrated Five-Year Work Plan, which includes a concept phase, design phase, right of way phase, and construction phase. Typically the lifespan of a project is 3-5 years.
 - Upcoming projects in the neighborhood include Collister, Taft, Pierce Park at State, and chip sealing maintenance (this summer).
 - Boise has good pavement conditions because of aggressive maintenance.
 - How are speed limits determined?
 - ACHD assessments
 - Studies show that the accidents are reduced and less severe when speeds are lower.
 - City of Boise Pathways Program
 - The city has transit goals and objectives, including Pathways, which is 130+ miles of off-street transit paths.

- Upon completion of the plan, 75% of Boise residents would be within a 10-minute walk of a pathway.
- It is a multi stakeholder process to link residents with destinations.
- Vision Zero: Proposed philosophical change to treat car crashes like plane crashes and examine why they occur in an effort to eliminate them. The city has a vision zero task force
- COMPASS safe streets for all planning efforts to identify themes in fatal crashes.
- Ways to support Pathways: visit their website; build a coalition of support; focus on neighborhood investment to help get property owners on board.

Treasure Valley Cycling Alliance

- Temporary Concerns: Obstructions and temporary hazards in the roadways. Solutions:
 Fill out the ACHD Tell Us Form or contact non-emergency dispatch.
- Long-term Concerns: Unsafe intersections, missing sidewalks and bike paths. Solutions:
 Tell Us Form, attend ACHD Commission meetings, contact our commissioner (Maranda).
- Advocacy can make a difference.
- Upcoming Meetings / Ways to give feedback
 - Public Hearing on Taft Corridor Plan May 22
 - o Open comment period for State Street between 8th and 14th engage.achd.org
 - Timing is important, so look at proposals and speak out during comment periods.
 - Treat public employees with respect, and know the right time to comment.
